- i. Matt 7:3-5
 - 1. ³ And why do you look at the speck in your brother's eye, but do not consider the plank in your own eye? ⁴ Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me remove the speck from your eye'; and look, a plank is in your own eye? ⁵ Hypocrite! First remove the plank from your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye.

- V. How does this happen?
 - a. K#4 The two reasons people practice hypocrisy:
 - i. They're trying to purposely mislead, or
 - ii. They aren't able to sustain who they profess to be because unwanted things within them which continue to rise to the surface.
 - iii. Both reasons indicate there is a hidden problem.
 - b. Red Flags that We Have Shadowy Areas in Our Hearts
 - K#5 We become fixated on external preferences instead of internal devotion.
 - ii. K#6 We become fixated on commitment/tasks instead of our heart and other people.
 - iii. K#7 We hide our double standards with strict rules (usually for others).
 - iv. K#8 We have areas of our lives that remain untransformed because we ignore them, hide them, and sweep them under the rug

- 1. Col 3:8-17
 - a. ⁸ But now you yourselves are to put off all these: anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy language out of your mouth. 9 Do not lie to one another, since you have put off the old man with his deeds, ¹⁰ and have put on the new man who is renewed in knowledge according to the image of Him who created him, ¹¹ where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcised nor uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave nor free, but Christ is all and in all. 12 Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering; 13 bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do. 14 But above all these things put on love, which is the bond of perfection. 15 And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body; and be thankful. 16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. ¹⁷ And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.
