







week 07 Live With Expectation Titus 3:6-9

session overview

Theme: A Spirit-filled life isn't marked by scarcity, but by supernatural abundance. The Holy Spirit transforms every part of us, our character, desires, abilities, and confidence, so that we can live fully expectant of God's ongoing work.

opening prayer (2 min)

Example: "Father, we praise You for pouring out Your Spirit on us through Jesus Christ. Open our eyes today to live with expectation, not based on what we see, but what You've promised. Stir our hearts to trust the fullness of Your Spirit's work. In Jesus' name, Amen."

highlights (15 min)

Intro Reflection:

Have you ever tried to live on "empty", physically, emotionally, or spiritually? What did that look like? Why do so many Christians today live as if they expect very little from God?

Key Quote to Discuss:

"A good church fosters a culture of dependence upon the Holy Spirit with an expectation of spiritual abundance."

time to consider (30 min)

Read Aloud: Titus 3:6-9 "...whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior..."

1. Expect the Spirit to Empower Your Mission

From the beginning, the Spirit was given not just for personal comfort but for mission (Acts 1:8).

discussion questions

- What are some signs that a person is truly being transformed by the Spirit?
- What's one area in your life where you long to see transformation?
- Why do we often settle for "spiritual survival" rather than expect real growth?

2. Expect the Spirit to Empower Your Mission

discussion questions

- How does the Spirit equip you to witness and serve others?
- Where in your life do you sense God calling you to act in boldness?
- How does being "an heir of eternal life" fuel your purpose?


3. Expect the Spirit to Meet You in Weakness

The world lives with a scarcity mindset: "There's never enough." But the Spirit says, "Rivers of living water."

Contrast Activity (Reflect & Discuss):

Compare these statements. Which do you tend to believe more, and why?

Scarcity	Abundance
"I'm running on empty."	"His grace is more than enough."
"I'll never change."	"The Spirit is making all things new."
"I have to protect what's mine."	"You're an heir of eternal life



discussion questions

- Which "scarcity lie" hits closest to home for you?
- What would it look like to live from spiritual abundance instead?

missional living (30 min)

Living It Out:

- Reflect: Where in your life have you settled for less than Spirit-empowered abundance?
- **Practice:** Start your mornings this week with this simple prayer: "Holy Spirit, I welcome Your presence. Fill me again today."
- **Share:** Tell someone this week about how God is transforming an area of your life. Be honest, and hopeful.

Challenge: Memorize John 7:38 and speak it over your life when you feel dry.

reach our world (10 min)

Prayer Focus:

- Pray for people in our city who are spiritually dry, disconnected, disillusioned, or disappointed with faith.
- Ask God to break through spiritual droughts with living water.
- Pray that Awaken Las Vegas would be a Spirit-empowered, fruit-bearing community in a barren land.

closing prayer (5 min)

Commit to this in Prayer:

"Holy Spirit, we don't want to just believe in You, we want to depend on You. Make our lives look like orchards, not deserts. Help us expect great things from You, because You are the God who pours out richly. In Jesus' name, Amen."

final takeaways

- Posture Cultivate expectation. Pray like God actually answers.
- Community Stir each other's faith. Encourage one another to believe for more.
- Conviction You were not saved to survive, you were saved to flourish.

memory verse

"Whoever believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." John 7:8
