Why Church Matters: The Power of Grace

Titus 2:11-15

We are on our series, *Why Church Matters*, and recently we saw how sound doctrine shapes us towards godly living — and how the local church is the place where sound doctrine is elevated and takes root through real relationships, especially through intergenerational discipleship.

This is the beautiful thing: When that happens, the gospel becomes visible and attractive.

In today's passage, Paul reminds us — that the power that connects sound doctrine with godly living is the **grace of God**.

Question: How has your understanding of grace shaped the way you live?

**MP:** Grace isn't just something we receive once; it's what empowers us to reflect Jesus and live for Jesus until His return.

<sup>11</sup> For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, <sup>12</sup> training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age,

Grace is not a license to sin; grace saves and empowers us.

God's grace became visible in the person and work of Jesus.

Grace is a two-way gift: it saves and empowers us.

How can we allow God's grace to train us and strengthen us?

2 Timothy 2:1 You then, my child, be strengthened by the grace that is in Christ Jesus,

- **Abide in Christ daily:** We don't earn grace through spiritual habits, but we open ourselves to grace through them.
- **Embrace weakness:** Grace meets us, not at the end of our strength, but in the confession of our need.
- Walk in humility and dependence: Grace flows not through pride but through surrender
- **Engage in Christian Community:** God often will deliver the grace that you need through the words, prayer and presence of others.
- **Preach the Gospel to yourself:** The Gospel of grace isn't just the starting point, it's the ground we stand on every day.

What Jesus did in the past impacts our present and shapes our hope for the future.
<sup>13</sup> waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus
Christ, <sup>14</sup> who gave himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for himself a people for
his own possession who are zealous for good works.
For the Church to truly matter in the world, it must raise up Spiritual leaders who have been deeply impacted by grace—leaders who don't just talk about Jesus but are being transformed by Jesus.
<sup>15</sup> Declare these things; exhort and rebuke with all authority. Let no one disregard you.
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
