Week 15 | A New System | John 8:1-12

YOU DON'T KNOW YOU'RE IN DARKNESS UNTIL YOU SEE THE LIGHT

In your opinion, what are the most famous 'go-to' Bible verses during Christmas? Most will say Luke 2:1-40, but I would suggest that Isaiah 9:2-6 should easily make it into the top 3. Of course, we are most familiar with verse 6, "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." But verse 2, which reads, "those who dwelt in deep darkness, onto them a light has shone," provides the real context for the Christmas story. More often than not, pastors will rightly identify sin and Rome's oppression as the deep darkness that preceded the incarnation. But I want to suggest something else. Something that made the darkness uniquely deep and evil were the religious leaders and their system that twisted the law to oppress people and keep them in their sins. A system that misrepresented God and separated His people from Him. It was during the Feast of Tabernacles that Jesus fulfilled Isaiah 9:2, declaring Himself to be the Light of the World, dispelling this false religious system, and revealing the true heart of the Father. The story of the woman caught in adultery is one of the greatest illustrations of His victory over this evil. His words, though few, reverberate with power today, "Neither do I condemn you; go, and from now on sin no more."

Leaders: Take your group through each section: Pray, Reflect, and Reach. Keep in mind the time allowances. In the Reflect section, feel free to focus on several of these questions instead of all as time allows.



PRAY (10 min)

As a Life Group, take time to reflect and pray over this weekend's message. Thank Jesus for how He rescued you from darkness and graciously set you free from sin.



REFLECT (25 min)

As you've had the opportunity to reflect on what God has spoken to you through the lesson this week, consider these questions as a group and discuss them.

- 1. Discuss the danger of 'spiritual leaders' creating unbiblical religious systems that pervert God's truth and oppress people. Discuss topics like: the danger of misrepresenting God, self-righteousness, and desiring justice instead of mercy. Can you think of modern examples of this?
- 2. Jesus had to silence the oppressive voice of darkness before He spoke the life-changing truth to this woman. He did so by saying to these religious leaders, "Let him who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." **Why was this so convicting to them? How can this statement keep us from making the dangerous mistake of being hypocritical or having double standards?**

3. As this woman was being publicly humiliated and put to shame, Jesus demonstrated His love for her. He revealed how the Father truly saw her and He set her free. His words, "Neither do I condemn you; go, and from now on sin no more" brought mercy, forgiveness, hope, and truth to her. **Describe how He has done these same things in your life.**

4. Setting people free from sin was why Christ came and conquered darkness. **Discuss as a group how you can share this message with people this Christmas season. Be creative and come up with concrete ideas that you can implement. Be willing to do things as a group.**
