Week 25 | THE POWER OF ABIDING | John 15:1-11

THERE IS NO JOY IN THIS WORLD LIKE UNION WITH CHRIST THE MORE WE CAN FEEL IT, THE HAPPIER WE ARE. C.H. SPURGEON

Metaphors are powerful tools for communication. They provide a picture to help us see complex things that we don't quite understand in terms of simple things that we do understand. The marketing world has effectively harnessed this power, using meaningful motifs such as the journey, relationships, or even war to inspire and engage people to buy their products. But Jesus was the Master of the metaphor, and He used them brilliantly and precisely. For example, when Jesus wanted people to understand that there was only one way to God, He said, "I am the Door." When He wanted His disciples to understand His care for His people, He said, "I am the Good Shepherd." Or when He desired people to know that they could find truth in a world of darkness, He said, "I am the Light of the World." And in the Scriptures we are considering for this study, when Jesus described what it was like to have a relationship with Him and the Father, He said, "I am the True Vine, and you are the branches." Notice that He didn't say, "I am the business owner, and you are the customer," or, "I am the store, and you are the shopper," or, "I am the General, and you are the soldier." A relationship with Christ means a living union and communion that leads to fruitfulness in our lives. Just as the branch abides in the vine and bears fruit, so will we as we abide in Christ. What a beautiful metaphor this is, indeed.

Leaders: Take your group through each section: Pray, Reflect, and Reach. Keep in mind the time allowances. In the Reflect section, feel free to focus on several of these questions instead of all as time allows.



As a Life Group, reflect and pray over this weekend's message. Spend time thanking God that you are "in Christ." United to Him in faith.



As you've had the opportunity to reflect on what God has spoken to you through the lesson this week, consider these questions as a group and discuss them.

1. What does it mean to be "in Christ"? Use the notes from Sunday's message and spend time searching for the phrase "in Christ" in the New Testament. Write down what you discover and discuss. According to the teaching, how does a person become "in Christ"?

Explain how this illustrates a Christian's relationship with Christ, Discuss what it means to "abide" in concrete terms.

What tools does God use to prune? Is there anything in your life that is spiritually unhealthy that needs to be pruned away so that you can become more fruitful? What will you do about that?
